
We strive to develop confident and compassionate American Muslims who are inspired by the beauty of Islam and whose faith is a guide and source of strength in their daily lives.


ICB: Co-operative Model

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


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

The Importance of Social Networks

"Social relationships...operate to nurture, sustain, and encourage religious engagement of all sorts. These circumstances, then, argue for a broadening of the very concept of 'religious education' to embrace the formation and bestowal of social networks."

Religion Curriculum - What's New

Increased focus on the classroom experience

ARABIC LANGUAGE

Goal: Develop a familiarity and appreciation for the Arabic language

QUR'ANIC READING

Goal: Develop a love and appreciation for the Qur'an

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What's New in Arabic/Qur'anic Curriculum

Surah memorization moving from Religion to Arabic / Qur'anic Arabic

- First period teachers are most qualified to teach proper pronunciation
- Allows religion to incorporate more engaging projects/activities

Students will be expected to learn the English meaning along with the Arabic

Goal for 2019-2020 is to combine the Arabic/Qur'anic track

- Incorporate the best of both Arabic and Qur'anic Arabic curricula
- Link Arabic more deeply to children's Islamic identity
- Add focus on comprehension to Qur'anic curriculum

Sunday School



Surah Memorization 2018-19

- Number of surahs reduced to enhance learning and encourage application
- Memorization of English translation expected along with the Arabic
- Surahs reordered to facilitate age-appropriate conversations
- Surah memorization extended through 10th Grade to cultivate life-long learners

Abdullah ibn Mas'ud said: "We used to learn ten ayat at a time, not learning more until we had implemented them [in our lives]."



Homework Expectations

- Parents share responsibility for their children's assignments
- Involvement with Arabic/Qur'anic Reading homework especially important
- No more than 30 minutes per class per week
- Posted on the website by Wednesday

Is the lunch provided for everyone, or just children?

➤ Pizza is for students and teachers only during lunch period (11:15-11:45). If there is pizza left over after the bell rings for second period, others are welcome to it.

Can I bring in leftover food from a catered event to serve here?

➤ Yes, but it must be given to the Snack Lead to be handled for distribution at their discretion. It will only be served after first period begins.





Can you change my child's class assignment?

➤ There is a short answer (I'm sorry, no) and a long answer.

What do I do with my child's old books for Quranic Reading or Arabic?

➤ They are reused. Bring your child's Quranic Reading or Arabic books from last year to use this year.



Can my child attend only one period?

➤ The current policy is that children must enroll in and regularly attend in both periods.

What is the attendance policy?

➤ Based on the Student & Parent Guidelines (you will receive), students must attend greater than 50% of classes in order to be eligible for a guaranteed spot in the following year's enrollment. Exceptions may be made for extended excused absences on a case-by-case basis.
